



## Learning activities as Open Educational

#### Resources

The Stepup2ICT partners have developed various open educational resources (OERs), suggesting activities to be carried out during the process of adult education.

Since new skills are required for planning and using new learning environments with the potential of digital technologies, in the StepUp project the idea is to create and share some learning activities that make use of information and communication technologies for the different areas of action of the adult educator.

Each learning activity which is shared on the project website contains a description, a justification of the advantages of carrying out the activity, a short description of the ICT tool to be used and a step by step description on how to carry out the activity. Each activity focuses on the usefulness of online tools for adult educators.

### Training programme for adult educators

A training programme to promote educators' capabilities and proficiency in using e-resources in adult education and training has been created. The training course has been planned for 30 hours of learning time. The programme is built according to modules with defined learning outcomes. The training programme is focused on eLearning material to be found on https://stepup2ict.eu/course in a moodle environment.

It consists of training material, readings, activities, exercises, external links and tests in order to be able to develop competences on the use of ICT in different phases of adult education courses.

The Stepup2ICT training programme provides modules on 6 main areas of adult education:

- Coordination of training
- 2. Training needs assessment
- 3. Training content design
- 4. Training development
- 5. Training delivery
- 6. Training evaluation

Partners are now translating the training course in their local languages and will soon offer 20 hours training to 10 adult educators.


























# Further research on the use of ICT by adult educators
